There are so many things you will need to do to prepare for the arrival of your little one, but one of the most important things you can do is put together your support team!

Finding a doula to support you during pregnancy, birth and the postpartum stage can make all the difference in your birth experience.

A great doula is a guide and she will lead you through your own heroic birth journey with compassion, patience, wisdom and quite possibly a little magic (or it will feel that way at the time!). Does having a doula guarantee a "perfect" birth experience? No...but having a doula can change the way you perceive your birth.

A doula is an objective caregiver, like a sister or a mother (sans any judgment!), who will help you understand your options. She works with you to envision your ideal birth, remind you of your vision when times get tough and holds your hand, massages your back and squeezes your hips through it all. Doulas really are considered their own form of pain relief.

Okay, but what does a doula specifically do?

**Educates you** in advance of labor to help you learn about the birth process, birth choices, and potential interventions

Provides emotional, mental and physical support during labor

Provides **continuous labor support** and is there as soon as you need encouragement and coping techniques

Serves as an **advocate for you**, helping the birth team collaborate to achieve your desired birth goals

**Provides support for the partner,** allowing him or her to participate as desired

Whatever. Is. Required. From the mundane to the mystical, your doula is your partner through it all

# What is included in doula services?

Every doula provides different services or packages, but in general this is what you will find included:

- One or two prenatal visits to discuss your vision & goals
- Telephone and email support throughout the pregnancy
- Continuous support during labor and delivery, meeting you either at your home or the hospital
- One or two postpartum visits to check on you and the baby and help provide breastfeeding support, baby care tips and processing of birth experience

#### How much does a doula cost?

Services are usually a flat rate, not hourly. Doula rates vary based on how much training/education she has, how much experience, what the comparable rate is in your city, and what her income needs are.

If price is an issue, seek out a doula-in-training, who may offer a discounted rate. Many doulas offer other services! Childbirth classes, massage, lactation support, placenta encapsulation, postpartum services, etc. so don't forget to ask! Print this out to simplify the process!

# WHiring Your Doula Checklist



Identify your criteria and priorities for doula support



Find doulas matching your criteria from resource lists and websites



Create a list of doulas that interest you (8-10)



Reach out via email to see if they have availability for your birth (be sure to share your "due date") and are able to meet up for an interview



Interview 3-5 doulas (bring along your list of questions!)



Determine the best person to support your labor based on your priorities, criteria and gut feelings (and your partner's input)



Hire your doula! Hooray!
